This past year's 'Agape Strong-From Adversity to Opportunity Gala' was our most successful in our history. With the additional funds that came in after the event we exceeded \$25,000!

Since July of 2014 (the beginning of our fiscal year) we received the Community Partner Award through MCJFS for Agape's services to our community, and were again selected as a finalist in the Ohio Association of Non-Profit Organizations Award of Excellence. If these honors were not enough, in October we received a \$15,000 grant from the CareSource Foundation that supported our 'first' annual Foster family Training Conference.

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AYC - Agape Youth Council

AYC is in full swing, and we're having a great time! We have incorporated "fun days" into our curriculum, so that we are to able get to know each other better as a group. We are pleased to have added new members to AYC and welcome any more who might like to join us.

During the month of March we discussed Nutrition & Health with dietician and friend, Ms. Destiny Temple, RD LD. She shared with us healthy choices in snacking and how to incorporate healthy living into our daily lives. This provided an introduction into a Nutrition & Health 3-part incentive that will be presented by the OSU EFNEP (Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program). This program through OSU provides teens to learn more about a healthy lifestyle through the "MyPlate" curriculum. "MyPlate" has replaced the "Food Pyramid" diagram, in demonstrating the five building blocks for a healthy diet. Each youth who attends will take a pre-test to test their knowledge of

healthy eating and then will take a post-test at the end of the series to test what they have learned. Each session will consist of food demos, examples and also some take-home learning tools. The members of AYC can attend to earn cash prizes and certificates of completion. This course will run for three consecutive meetings for three months. We are excited to be able to offer new trainings and options to the members of AYC!

As many of you know, AYC participates in quarterly community service projects with other non-profit organizations in the area and we are thrilled to have the opportunity this month to help The Food Bank with their back pack lunch program. ODJFS and Agape for Youth, Inc. requires sixty hours of training every two years foster parents have a license. Training is essential to the process of learning new skills to manage behaviors and to cope with the emotional volatility of children in foster care. For experienced foster parents training is part of the requirement to keep the foster care license and they learn some new facts and techniques that enhance their already well developed skills. Training is important both for gaining skills and keeping children safe as CPR and First Aid continuous certification is part of this requirement.

Please check the number of training hours you have completed and how many more hours you need before your recertification date. Check your CPR/First Aid cards or call/email us to find out when your certification expires. An expired certification puts children, foster families and Agape for Youth at risk, should an emergency situation occur that required the administration of life saving CPR or First Aid. We know that everyone is busy, but the safety of our children is worth taking the time to make sure your certification is current.

The Ohio Department of Job and Family Services Rule addressing CPR/First Aid follows:

5101:2-5-33 Foster Caregiver Continuing Training

9) A foster caregiver certified to operate a specialized foster home shall complete a minimum of sixty hours of continuing training during each certification period. The continuing training program shall be in accordance with the caregiver's written needs assessment and continuing training plan and shall include, if applicable, the training listed in paragraph (C)(7) of this rule, and additional issues specific to the types of children placed in the type of specialized foster home for which the caregiver is certified. Such training shall also include continuous maintenance of certification in a first aid training program and a child and adult CPR certification training program such as those training programs offered by the American Red Cross, the American heart association, or the equivalent.

The current version of this rule became effective: 03/01/2010


